## JOINT APPLICATION OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY (U 338-E) AND SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY (U 902-E) FOR THE 2012 NUCLEAR DECOMMISSIONING COST TRIENNIAL PROCEEDING

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Dated: December 21, 2012

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In compliance with Ordering Paragraph No. 7 of California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) Decision (D.) 95-07-055½ and Ordering Paragraph Nos. 6-8 of D.07-01-003,² as modified by the filing date set in the Executive Director's letter dated July 5, 2011, to Southern California Edison Company (SCE),³ SCE and San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E) (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Utilities"), hereby submit their Joint Application for the 2012 Nuclear Decommissioning Cost Triennial Proceeding (NDCTP).

In D.95-07-055, in the Commission's OII 86 Re Present and Alternative Methods of Financing Nuclear Facility Decommissioning Costs, the Commission ordered all electric Utilities that own nuclear generating facilities, including SCE and SDG&E, to update their "engineering cost studies and ratepayer contribution analysis" for nuclear decommissioning costs every three years. D.95-07-055, Ordering Paragraph 7, (mimeo), p. 30.

In D.07-01-003, the Commission ordered SCE, SDG&E, and Pacific Gas and Electric Company to serve additional testimony in their triennial review regarding personnel qualifications, low level radioactive waste storage forecasts, and an appropriate contingency factor for inclusion in the decommissioning revenue requirements. D.07-01-003, Ordering Paragraph Nos. 6-8, (mimeo), pp. 33-34.

Mr. Clanon's July 5, 2011 letter to SCE granted the request of SCE, San Diego Gas & Electric Company, and Pacific Gas and Electric Company to file their applications on December 14, 2012. On December 12, 2012, Mr. Clanon granted the utilities an additional one-week extension of time, setting the filing date for the instant application as December 21, 2012.

#### THIS JOINT APPLICATION IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH COMMISSION DECISIONS

#### A. <u>Summary of Request</u>

In this Joint Application, the Utilities request the Commission:

- (1) Find the \$14.9 million (100% share, 2011\$) cost of San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station (SONGS) Unit 1 Decommissioning Work completed between January 1, 2009 and December 31, 2012 is reasonable;
- (2) Find that the updated \$182.3 million (100% share, 2011\$) SONGS 1 decommissioning cost estimate for the Remaining Work is reasonable; and
- (3) Find the updated \$4,119.0 million (100% share, 2011\$) SONGS 2 & 3 decommissioning cost estimate reasonable.

In addition, SCE requests the Commission:

- (1) Find the updated \$513.5 million (SCE share, 2010\$) Palo Verde decommissioning cost estimate reasonable; and
- (2) Authorize rate recovery of its increased contribution of \$40.98 million to its Nuclear Decommissioning Trust Funds for SONGS Units 2 & 3 through the Nuclear Decommissioning Cost Charge, effective January 1, 2014. The associated revenue requirement associated with this contribution is \$41.44 million.

In addition to the foregoing requests by SCE, SDG&E further requests that the Commission:

- (1) Enter a finding that the updated estimate of SDG&E's ratable share of the decommissioning costs for SONGS Units 1, 2 and 3 of \$36.46 million, \$400.625 million, and \$423.093 million, respectively, is reasonable;
- (2) Authorize a revenue requirement for SDG&E's annual contribution to its Nuclear Decommissioning Trust Fund for SONGS Units 1, 2 and 3 in the amount of \$16.43 million, effective January 1, 2014;
- (3) Authorize SDG&E to amortize the 2013 forecasted NDAM undercollection in rates for a twelve-month period beginning January 1, 2014; and

(3) Authorize SDG&E to file an advice letter within fifteen (15) days after the effective date of the Commission's order approving this application to adjust SDG&E's Nuclear Decommissioning Adjustment Mechanism ("NDAM") rates to reflect the annual contributions and revenue requirement as may be approved by the Commission. Based upon this application, SDG&E proposes a NDAM rate increase of ninety-one percent, or \$8.266 million annually from current rates. Furthermore, if SDG&E's request in this proceeding for the amortization of the 2013 forecasted NDAM undercollection of \$0.200 million is approved, for 2014 rates, the proposed NDAM rate would increase ninety-three percent from current rates. This increase reflects the transfer of funds from SDG&E's non-qualified trusts to its qualified trusts, an appropriate allowance for franchise fees and uncollectibles of 1.0275 percent and 0.1410 percent, respectively,<sup>4</sup> and funds received from SCE representing SDG&E's ratable share of an award of civil damages related to the failure of the United States Department of Energy to begin accepting spent nuclear fuel from SONGS Units 1, 2 and 3.5

#### B. This Application Comports With The Commission's Explicit Purposes Of The NDCTP.

As set forth by the Commission in D.10-07-047, the purposes of the [NDCTP] proceeding are "[1] to set the annual revenue requirements for the decommissioning trusts for the nuclear powerplants owned by Southern California Edison Company, San Diego Gas & Electric Company, and Pacific Gas and Electric Company, [2] to verify the utilities are in compliance with prior decisions applicable to decommissioning, and [3] to determine whether actual expenditures by the utilities for decommissioning activities are reasonable and prudent."

SCE owns an 80% interest in SONGS 1 and a 78.21% interest in SONGS 2 & 3, and is the decommissioning agent and operating agent for these respective facilities. SDG&E owns 20% interests in SONGS 1, 2, and 3. SCE also owns a 15.8% interest in Palo Verde. As discussed in Chapter IV of

Arizona Public Service Company owns a 29.10% interest in Palo Verde, and is the operating agent. The remaining non-operating owners are: Salt River Project (17.49%), El Paso Electric Company (15.80%), Public Service Company of New Mexico (10.20%), The Southern California Public Power Authority (5.91%), and Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (5.7%).

Exhibit SCE-1, Phase I of SONGS Unit 1 decommissioning was completed by December 31, 2008, and therefore there are no Phase I expenditures to review in this proceeding. Phase II of SONGS Unit 1 decommissioning commenced January 1, 2009 and is expected to be completed after the Department of Energy removes all SONGS 1 spent fuel from the site (estimated to be approximately year 2053). Phase III of SONGS Unit 1 decommissioning will occur concurrently with Phase III of SONGS 2 & 3 decommissioning, and is not expected to commence until year 2054.

With respect to the first purpose of the NDCTP cited by the Commission in D.10-07-047, i.e., to set the annual revenue requirement, the Utilities' respective revenue requirement requests are set forth at the beginning of Section I of this Application and are supported by the testimony presented in Exhibit Utilities-3. The Utilities have previously submitted decommissioning cost studies and ratepayer contribution analyses for nuclear decommissioning costs at SONGS and Palo Verde. This Joint Application likewise submits updated decommissioning cost studies and ratepayer contribution analyses for nuclear decommissioning contributions for SONGS and Palo Verde for the next three years, commencing January 1, 2014.

With respect to the second purpose of the NDCTP set forth in D.10-07-047, i.e., to verify the utilities' compliance with prior decommissioning decisions, the Utilities' testimony in Exhibits SCE-1, SCE-2, and Utilities-3 support their compliance with prior decisions. In addition, in the Utilities' last NDCTP proceeding, the Commission in Decision No. 10-07-047 identified three new requirements for this instant application:

- The Utilities are to provide contribution estimates assuming successful completion of license renewal. In support of this requirement, the Utilities have submitted testimony in Exhibit Utilities-3.
- The Utilities are to report pro rata share of funds accumulated for Nuclear Regulatory Commission License termination (radiological decommissioning to meet the Nuclear

Regulatory Commission standard for license termination) and provide copies of their most recent funding assurance letters sent to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission. 10 In support of this requirement, the Utilities have submitted testimony in Exhibits SCE-1 and SCE-2.

• The Utilities are to report any responsive information from the United States Department of Navy relating to the applicable site restoration and remediation standards after termination of the SONGS site lease. In support of this requirement, the Utilities have submitted testimony in Exhibit SCE-2.

In addition, in Decision No. 11-07-003, also from the Utilities' last NDCTP proceeding, the Commission ordered the Utilities to attach to this instant application the common summary format that identifies key information from their nuclear decommissioning cost estimates and proposed revenue requirements. This summary is included as part of this Application as Attachment I.

Finally, this Joint Application is made to ensure compliance with requirements to decommission the SONGS and Palo Verde facilities and with the Nuclear Facilities Decommissioning Act. As holders of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) license, the Utilities, on behalf of their customers, have an unavoidable obligation, under federal regulation, to decommission the SONGS facilities.<sup>13</sup> The Utilities' customers are required to provide funding to decommission SONGS.<sup>14</sup> The Utilities do not own the site upon which the SONGS facilities are located. Instead, they are authorized to use the site under grants of easement and leases from the U.S. Department of the Navy and the California State Lands Commission. The SONGS site lease contracts and grants of easement also require the Utilities to decommission the SONGS facility.<sup>15</sup>

Upon termination of the grants of easement, the utilities are required to remove all improvements they installed or constructed on the site, return the site to the condition satisfactory to the grantors, and return the site to the grantors.

As one of the holders of the NRC license for Palo Verde, SCE, on behalf of its customers, also has an unavoidable obligation, under federal regulation, to decommission its share of Palo Verde. SCE's customers are required to provide funding to decommission SCE's share of Palo Verde. The Nuclear Facility Decommissioning Act of 1985, Public Utilities Code Section 8321, et seq., requires the Commission to authorize the Utilities "to collect sufficient revenues and rates to make the maximum contributions" to the decommissioning trust funds, to the maximum extent deductible for federal and state income tax purposes pursuant to Internal Revenue Code Section 468A and applicable regulations, "and to otherwise recover the revenue requirements associated with reasonable and prudent decommissioning costs of the nuclear facilities for purposes of making contributions into other funds established" pursuant to the Act. 18

The Energy Policy Act of 2005 amended section 468A to allow all nuclear decommissioning liability to be funded through the use of Qualified Trusts. In their previous NDCTP filing, the Utilities requested and received approval from the Commission to amend their trust agreements for such fund transfers as provided for by section 468A. The requests were contingent on seeking permission from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) for such transfer, and ensuring that such transfers comport with California state law. On October 13, 2012, SCE submitted Advice Letter 2639-E informing the Commission that it had received approval from the IRS to complete the special transfer of assets from the SONGS 1 and 2 nonqualified trusts to the SONGS 1 and 2 qualified trust, respectively, within certain dates of receipt of the IRS rulings. Through the advice letter, SCE sought Commission approval to amend its qualified and nonqualified decommissioning trust agreements to permit this transfer, which the Commission approved on November 16, 2011. The Utilities' testimony on the pourover from the SONGS 2 nonqualified trust to the SONGS 2 qualified trust is found in Exhibit Utilities-3.

With respect to the third purpose of the NDCTP cited by the Commission in D.10-07-047, i.e., to determine the reasonablenesss of actual decommissioning expenditures, the Commission in D. 07-01-013 stated that, "with respect to Phase 1 SONGS 1 decommissioning work, the Commission in D.99-06-007 adopted a ratemaking settlement that included a presumption that the utilities' conduct is reasonable in performing Phase 1 SONGS 1 decommissioning work if the scope of the work completed and the most recently approved SONGS 1 decommissioning cost estimate bound the costs incurred." If the actual costs incurred are within the estimate, "any entity claiming the utilities acted unreasonably would, therefore, bear the burden of proving the utilities acted unreasonably." Phase I decommissioning work for SONGS 1 was completed on or about December 31, 2008. With respect to Phase II decommissioning of SONGS 1,22 which commenced on or about January 1, 2009, the CPUC set the following reasonableness standard's reasonableness standard:

"[W]e define reasonableness for decommissioning expenditures consistent with prior Commission findings; i.e., that the reasonableness of a particular management action depends on what the utility knew or should have known at the time that the managerial decision was made."23

The Utilities' testimony on the actual decommissioning expenditures for SONGS 1 is found in Exhibit SCE-1.

II.

## THE UTILITIES REQUEST APPROVAL OF THEIR PROPOSED CONTRIBUTION LEVELS TO THEIR RESPECTIVE DECOMMISSIONING TRUST FUNDS

The Utilities used four key elements to determine their proposed decommissioning funds contribution requirements: (1) decommissioning cost studies, (2) escalation projections, (3) estimates of after-tax rates of return, and (4) current decommissioning trust balances. In developing their decommissioning cost studies, the Utilities assumed that SONGS 2 & 3 would be decommissioned using

that Palo Verde would be decommissioned using the same method after each unit's NRC operating license expire. SCE assumed license expires. The prompt removal/dismantling method proceeds with decontamination, dismantling, and removal of the plant with no dormancy period in which the unit is placed in protective storage. The decommissioning cost studies assumed that the permanently closed SONGS 1 unit would continue to be decommissioned. The SONGS 1, SONGS 2 & 3, and Palo Verde decommissioning costs estimates were based on the use of current technologies under current regulations. The cost estimates are sufficient to develop a reasonable estimate of the scope and cost of future work in order to set aside sufficient funds.

SONGS 1 was permanently closed in 1992 and, as authorized in D.99-06-007, the Utilities commenced decommissioning SONGS 1 in 1999. Using the most recent decommissioning cost estimate for SONGS 1, and in comparison to the SONGS 1 trust funds balances plus the non-qualified trust fund tax benefits, no further contributions to those funds are needed. However, the Utilities request authorization to continue to recover an annual revenue requirement for contributions to their Nuclear Decommissioning Trust Funds for SONGS 2 & 3.

#### A. No Further Contributions To SONGS 1 Decommissioning Trust Funds Are Needed

As shown in the table below, SCE's and SDG&E's SONGS 1 Decommissioning Trust Funds, plus the tax benefits associated with the SCE and SDG&E Nonqualified Trusts for SONGS 1, contain sufficient monies to complete SONGS 1 decommissioning activities based on the 2012 SONGS 1 Cost Estimate for the Remaining Decommissioning Work of \$182.3 million (100% share, 2011\$) provided in this Joint Application.

However, the Utilities should be authorized to continue to use the tax benefits associated with the expenditures of the SONGS 1 Non-qualified Decommissioning Trust Funds to ensure that all SONGS 1 decommissioning costs can be paid out of existing monies.<sup>24</sup>

### B. The Commission Should Authorize SCE To Contribute \$40.98 Million And SDG&E To Contribute \$16.239 Million Each Year To Their Nuclear Decommissioning Trust Funds

The 2012 SONGS 2 & 3 Decommissioning Cost Estimate remained relatively flat at \$4.12 billion (100% share, 2011\$) over the 2009 SONGS 2 & 3 Decommissioning Cost Estimate of \$4.08 billion (100% share, 2011\$) adopted in the 2009 NDCTP.25

To estimate the contributions needed to fund the decommissioning of SONGS 2 & 3 and Palo Verde fully, annual escalation rate projections were used to convert the decommissioning cost estimates in base-year dollars to decommissioning cost estimates in future-year dollars. Escalation rates were based on projections from IHS Global Insight, a highly respected economic forecasting firm that the Commission has relied upon for many years. Similarly, SCE derived estimated trust fund asset returns from projections by IHS Global Insight. SCE calculated its estimated annual contribution (\$40.98 million) and revenue requirement based on these projections and other data, as explained in Exhibit Utilities-3. SCE's contribution and revenue requirement should be revised at the time of briefing, based on updated trust fund balances at that time.

With respect to SDG&E's ratable share of the estimated costs of decommissioning SONGS Units 1, 2 and 3, SDG&E determined the reasonable level of its annual contributions to its Nuclear Decommissioning Trust Funds and the associated annual revenue requirement based upon the decommissioning cost estimates by SCE and/or as prepared for SCE by ABZ, Incorporated, such estimates having been provided by SCE to the Commission for this application, and by taking a ratable

share of twenty percent (20%) to reflect SDG&E's ownership share of SONGS Units 1, 2 and 3, and then by reflecting:

- (a) Expected cost escalation rates provided by SCE, acting as SDG&E's Decommissioning Agent for SONGS Units 1, 2 and 3, to SDG&E;
- (b) SDG&E's forecast of the expected investment returns that might be generated from the various investments made using the funds in the Trusts for the period 2014 through 2022;
- (c) The trust account balances in SDG&E's Nuclear Decommissioning Trust Fund as of September 30, 2012; and,
- (d) A credit entered, during May 2012, to the SDG&E Nuclear Decommissioning Adjustment Mechanism (NDAM) balancing account to reflect the receipt of funds from SCE resulting from an award of civil damages related to the failure of the United States Department of Energy to begin accepting spent nuclear fuel from SONGS Units 1, 2 and 3.

Under the various agreements pursuant to which SDG&E's ownership interests in its twenty percent (20%) share of SONGS Units 1, 2 and 3 are administered and managed, SCE acts as the Decommissioning Agent for the owners of those units. Further, pursuant to these same agreements, SDG&E assumes it will be responsible for funding a full ratable twenty-percent share of the costs of decommissioning SONGS Units 1, 2 and 3. Taking this amount from the SCE cost estimates, the level of annual contributions required to fund the fully escalated costs of plant decommissioning allocable to SDG&E was determined using reasonable assumptions as to the SDG&E Nuclear Decommissioning Trust Fund balances as of December 31, 2013, and the reasonably achievable rates of return that might be generated from the various investments made using the funds in the Trusts for the period 2014 through 2022. This is the same methodology SDG&E has used for determining its necessary annual contributions and revenue requirements for the decommissioning of SONGS Units 1, 2 and 3 in prior Commission proceedings regarding these matters.

Under the currently effective guidelines regarding assets and asset allocations allowed within the SDG&E Nuclear Decommissioning Trust Fund, SDG&E determined the reasonably achievable post-fee, after-tax rate of return that may be earned within its Nuclear Decommissioning Trust Accounts would be

approximately 4.65 percent and 2.23 percent for the Qualified and Non-qualified Trusts, respectively. These assumptions were used in setting the annual contributions rate for the trust funds at \$16.239 million for the next triennial period.

For ratemaking purposes, SDG&E assumed the change in the level of annual contributions and revenue requirement would be effective January 1, 2014. The level of annual contributions determined by SDG&E was increased to provide an allowance for associated franchise fees and uncollectibles. At such time as SDG&E files its advice letter setting the NDAM rate for January 1, 2014, SDG&E will adjust its actual NDAM rate in accordance with the Commission's decision in this matter and update for any undercollection or overcollection that may exist in its NDAM balancing account.

Additionally, following the successful prosecution of claims brought by SCE against the United States Department of Energy, SCE distributed to SDG&E a ratable share of the civil damages awarded to SCE related to those claims. On or about May 30, 2012, SDG&E recorded the funds received from SCE, in the amount of \$15.3 million in its Nuclear Decommissioning Adjustment Mechanism balancing account. On or about October 31, 2012, SDG&E filed Advice Letter 2412-E<sup>26</sup> requesting that the Commission permit SDG&E to amortize the overcollection in the NDAM account resulting from the recordation of these funds in its NDAM account and to refund these funds to ratepayers in 2013.<sup>27</sup>

III.

## THE UTILITIES REQUEST THE COMMISSION DETERMINE THAT \$14.9 MILLION SPENT ON SONGS 1 DECOMMISSIONING WORK COMPLETED BETWEEN JANUARY 1, 2009 AND DECEMBER 31, 2012 WAS REASONABLE AND PRUDENT

Phase I decommissioning work for SONGS 1 was completed on or about December 31, 2008, and therefore is no longer within the scope of this application. With respect to Phase II decommissioning of SONGS 1,28 which commenced on or about January 1, 2009, the Commission set the following reasonableness standard:

"[W]e define reasonableness for decommissioning expenditures consistent with prior Commission findings; i.e., that the reasonableness of a particular management action depends on what the utility knew or should have known at the time that the managerial decision was made "29

In Exhibit No. SCE-1, the Utilities demonstrate that the \$14.9 million (100% share, 2011\$) cost of the SONGS 1 decommissioning work completed between January 1, 2009 and December 31, 2012 was reasonable.

IV.

#### STATUTORY AND PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS

#### A. Statutory Authority

This Joint Application is made in compliance with Decision Nos. 95-07-055 and 07-01-003, as modified by the filing date set in the Executive Director's letter dated July 5, 2011, to SCE and SDG&E. In addition, this request complies with the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (Commission Rule), and prior decisions, orders and resolutions of this Commission.

#### B. Compliance With Commission Rule Of Practice And Procedure 2.1

Commission Rule 2.1 requires that "[a]ll applications shall state clearly and concisely the authorization or relief sought; shall cite by appropriate reference the statutory provision or other authority under which Commission authorization or relief is sought, shall be verified by at least one applicant . . .; and . . . shall state the following: (a) [applicant information]; (b) [applicant service information]; (c) The proposed category for the proceeding, the need for hearing, the issues to be considered, and a proposed schedule. . . .; (d) Such additional information as may be required by the Commission in a particular proceeding." California Public Utilities Code § 1701.1(c)(3) defines ratesetting as "cases in which rates are established for a specific company, including, but not limited to, general rate cases, performance-based ratemaking, and other ratesetting mechanisms." SCE and SDG&E propose this application be designated as a "ratesetting" proceeding.

The issues to be considered in this application concern: (1) the reasonableness of the Utilities' decommissioning cost estimate for SONGS 2 & 3 and of SCE's decommissioning cost estimate for Palo Verde; (2) the Utilities' rate recovery of their contributions to their Decommissioning Trust Funds for SONGS 2 & 3; and (3) the reasonableness of the Utilities' \$14.9 million (100% share, 2011 dollars) cost of SONGS 1 Decommissioning Work performed from January 1, 2009 through December 31, 2012.

A copy of SCE's Certificate of Determination of Preferences of the Series E Preference Stock filed with the California Secretary of State on January 12, 2012, and a copy of SCE's Certificate of Increase of Authorized Shares of the Series E Preference Stock filed with the California Secretary of State on January 31, 2012, presently in effect, certified by the California Secretary of State, are being filed with the Commission on March 5, 2012, in connection with Application No. 12-03-004, and is by reference made a part hereof.

A copy of SCE's Certificate of Determination of Preferences of the Series F Preference Stock filed with the California Secretary of State on May 5, 2012, and as presently in effect, certified by the California Secretary of State, was filed with the Commission on June 29, 2012, in connection with Application No. 12-06-017, and is by reference made a part hereof.

#### E. <u>CEQA Compliance</u>

CEQA does not apply to this application. Public Resources Code section 21080(b)(8) states that CEQA does not apply to the "establishment, modification, structuring, restructuring, or approval of rates, tolls, fares, or other charges by public agencies."

#### F. Authority to Increase Rates – Rule 3.2

Rule 3.2 requires that applications for authority to increase rates, or to implement changes that would result in increased rates, contain the following data.

#### 1. Balance Sheet and Income Statement – Rule 3.2(a)(1)

Appendices A and B to this application contain copies of SCE and SDG&E's balance sheets and income statements as of September 30, 2012, the most recent period available.

#### 2. Present and Proposed Rates – Rule 3.2(a)(2) and (a)(3)

The cost-recovery mechanism proposal and the projected impact on rates are summarized below.

#### a) SCE

SCE is requesting to update its SONGS 2 & 3 Revenue Requirement from \$22.99 million to \$41.44 million, an increase of 0.2% percent annually beginning January 1, 2014, when compared to total system revenues at present rates (as of October 2012). The attached Appendix G is a copy of SCE's Notification of Application to Increase Electric Rates (Bill Insert). SCE received approval of the draft Bill Insert from the Commission's Public Advisor's Office on December 6, 2012.

#### b) SDG&E

SDG&E requests approval of an annual revenue requirement reflecting its annual contributions to the SDG&E Nuclear Decommissioning Trust Fund in the amount of \$16.239 million. SDG&E further requests authority to increase its NDAM rates by \$8.3 million beginning January 1, 2014. Attached to this application as Attachment H is a copy of SDG&E Notification of Application to Increase Electric Rates bill insert. SDG&E received approval of the draft Bill Insert from the Commission's Public Advisor's Office on December 18, 2012.

#### 3. Description of SCE's Service Territory and Utility System – Rule 3.2(a)(4)

Because this submittal is not a general rate application, this requirement is not applicable.

#### 4. Summary of Earnings – Rule 3.2(a)(5)

Rule 3.2(a)(5) requires:

#### 5. Depreciation – Rule 3.2(a)(7)

Because this submittal is not a general rate application, this requirement is not applicable.

#### 6. Capital Stock and Proxy Statement – Rule 3.2(a)(8)

Because this submittal is not a general rate application, this requirement is not applicable.

#### 7. <u>Statement Pursuant to Rule 3.2(a)(10)</u>

Rule 3.5(a)(10) requires the applicant to state whether its request is limited to passing through to customers "only increased costs to the corporation for the services or commodities furnished by it." This request is a pass through of costs.

#### **CONCLUSION**

In this Joint Application, the Utilities request the Commission: (1) to find the \$14.9 million (100% share, 2011\$) cost of San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station (SONGS) Unit 1 Decommissioning Work completed between January 1, 2009 and December 31, 2012 is reasonable; (2) to find the updated \$182.3 million (100% share, 2011\$) SONGS 1 decommissioning cost estimate for the Remaining Work is reasonable; and (3) to find the updated \$4,119.0 million (100% share, 2011\$) SONGS 2 & 3 decommissioning cost estimate is reasonable.

In addition, SCE requests the Commission to find the updated \$513.5 million (SCE share, 2010\$) Palo Verde decommissioning cost estimate is reasonable.

Finally, SCE requests that the Commission authorize rate recovery of its increased contribution of \$40.98 million to its Nuclear Decommissioning Trust Funds for SONGS Units 2 & 3 through the Nuclear Decommissioning Cost Charge, effective January 1, 2014. The associated revenue requirement associated with this contribution is \$41.44 million.

SDG&E requests the Commission grant SDG&E the following relief and authorities:

- (1) Find that the updated estimate of SDG&E's ratable share of the decommissioning costs for SONGS Units 1, 2 and 3 of \$36.46 million, \$400.625 million, and \$423.093 million is reasonable;
- (2) Authorize a revenue requirement for SDG&E's annual contribution to its Nuclear Decommissioning Trust Fund for SONGS Units 1, 2 and 3 in the amount of \$16.43 million, effective January 1, 2014; and,
- (3) Authorize SDG&E to file an advice letter within fifteen (15) days after the effective date of the Commission's order approving this application to adjust SDG&E's NDAM rates to reflect this revenue requirement and annual contribution. Based upon this application, SDG&E proposes a rate increase of \$8.3 million. This increase reflects an appropriate allowance for franchise fees of 1.0275 percent and uncollectibles of 0.1410 percent as approved by the Commission in Decision 08-07-046 dated July 31, 2008, and funds received from SCE representing SDG&E's ratable share of an award of //

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civil damages related to the failure of the United States Department of Energy to begin accepting spent nuclear fuel from SONGS Units 1, 2 and 3.

## APPLICATION NO. A.12-12-

On December 21, 2012, Southern California Edison Company (SCE) filed an application with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to set contribution levels for the company's nuclear decommissioning trust fund and other related issues in connection with San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station (SONGS) Units 1, 2, and 3.

In this application, SCE requests the CPUC to approve increased contribution to its Nuclear Decommissioning Trust Funds (NDCTP) for SONGS Units 2 & 3 and for Palo Verde Nuclear Generating Station Units 1, 2 & 3 after the end of their current Nuclear Regulatory Commission license periods. The current annual revenue requirement to cover contributions to SCE's trust funds is \$22.99 million. SCE is requesting that this revenue requirement be increased to \$41.44 million or 0.2% annually beginning January 1, 2014, when compared to total system revenues at present rates (as of October 2012).

## **ILLUSTRATIVE EFFECT ON ELECTRIC RATES AND BILLS**

The requested 2014 NDCTP revenue requirement results in an annual increase of \$18.45 million or 0.2% beginning January 1, 2014, when compared to total system revenues at present rates (as of October 2012). If total rates were to change as requested, an average residential customer using 600 kilowatt-hours (kWh) per month would see an increase of \$0.16 per month, from \$107.52 to \$107.68. The following table shows an estimate of proposed revenues and rate changes by customer group:



# SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY NOTICE OF APPLICATION AND PROPOSED CHANGE IN ELECTRIC RATES RECOVER THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE COMPANY'S NUCLEAR DECOMMISSIONING TRUST FUND APPLICATION NO. A. 12-12-XXX

On December 21, 2012, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E<sup>®</sup>) and Southern California Edison Company (SCE) filed a joint application (A.12-12-XXX) with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to set contribution levels for each company's nuclear decommissioning trust fund and other related issues in connection with San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station (SONGS) Units 1, 2 and 3<sup>1</sup>.

In this application, SDG&E requests the CPUC to approve increased contribution to its Nuclear Decommissioning Trust Funds for SONGS Units 2 and 3. The current annual revenue requirement to cover contributions to SDG&E's trust funds is \$8.17 million. SDG&E is requesting that these contributions be increased to \$16.43 million annually beginning January 1, 2014. The requested revenue requirement increase results in an annual increase of \$8.27 million or 101% from current funding.

SDG&E is also proposing to amortize the undercollection in the trust fund account for a 12-month period beginning January 1, 2014. If the proposal is authorized, the revenue requirement will increase by an additional \$0.20 million. The total proposed revenue requirement increase, including both the trust fund and amortization, results in an increase of \$8.47 million or 104% from current resulting from the funding and amortization requested in this proceeding.

#### ILLUSTRATIVE EFFECT ON ELECTRIC RATES AND BILLS

If the CPUC approves SDG&E's requests, a typical residential customer living in the inland climate zone and using 500 kilowatt-hours (kWh) per month could see a winter bill increase of \$0.10 per month, or 0.1%. A typical monthly electric bill could increase from \$83.52 to \$83.62. The following table shows the average rate impact to customers by class of SDG&E's requests in this application. The actual rates approved by the CPUC may be higher or lower that those requested by SDG&E. The percentages shown do not necessarily reflect the changes that you may see on your bill. Changes in individual bills will also depend on how much electricity each customer uses.

#### **EVIDENTIARY HEARINGS**

Evidentiary Hearings (EHs) **may** be held whereby parties of record will present their testimony and are subject to cross-examination before an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ). These EHs are open to the public, but only those who are parties of record can present evidence or cross-examine witnesses during the evidentiary hearings. After considering all evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned ALJ will issue a proposed decision. The CPUC may approve expenditures that differ from those SDG&E requests. The actual rates may result in changes greater or less than those described in this notice. If you wish to attend the EHs to listen only, and you are in need of special accommodations, please contact the PAO within 3-5 days in advance of the EHs. If EHs are scheduled, a separate notification to SDG&E customers regarding the dates, times and locations of these hearings will be sent as a separate bill insert or will appear as a newspaper notification.

The CPUC has its own court reporters who will record the comments of those formal parties of record participating in the EH's. After considering all proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned ALJ will issue a proposed decision. When the CPUC issues a final decision on the application, it may adopt, amend, or modify all or part of the ALJ's proposed decision as written. The CPUC's decision may be different than SDG&E's request.

#### **CPUC PROCESS**

The Division of Ratepayer Advocates (DRA) is an independent arm of the CPUC, created by the Legislature to represent the interests of all utility customers throughout the state to obtain the lowest possible rates for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels. DRA has a multi-disciplinary staff with expertise in economics, finance, accounting, and engineering.



#### Extent of site and building contamination

In the reactor building the fuel canal liner and all of the concrete located inside the containment liner was assumed to be removed and disposed of as LLRW. This precluded the scabbling (or drill and spall) of concrete surfaces in this building.

A fraction of the floor and wall concrete surfaces in radiologically contaminated buildings (penetration, fuel, auxiliary, radwaste storage) are assumed to be scabbled to an average depth of 0.5 inches. The fraction of floor area impacted was estimated to be approximately 20-25% of the concrete floor surface. The fraction of wall areas requiring scabbling were estimated as a fraction of the of the floor area impacted.

A fraction of concrete in radiologically contaminated buildings (penetration, fuel, auxiliary) are assumed to be more aggressively decontaminated to an average depth of 2 inches. The fraction of floor area requiring more aggressive decontamination was estimated to be approximately 40% of the floor area being scabbled.

No system or structure identified as contaminated upon final shutdown is assumed to become releasable due to decay during decommissioning.

All concrete surfaces in radiologically contaminated buildings (containment, penetration, fuel SEB, and radwaste) are assumed to be scabbled to an average depth of 0.5 inches.

In addition, historical unit operation data was used to identify areas that had been exposed to wet or dry contamination. This data was used to estimate the amount of concrete in contaminated buildings that will be assumed to be "volumetrically" contaminated with tritium, and thus dispositioned as LLRW.

No system or structure identified as contaminated upon final shutdown is assumed to become releasable due to decay during decommissioning.

LLRW and hazardous waste on site at beginning of decommissioning including large components

The 2011 study includes the disposition of radioactive material used to operate the DCPP site (such as refueling tools).

The study does include a cost allowance for closure of hazardous-only and mixed waste management units . Specific quantities of materials were not provided.

The 2011 study includes the cost for removal of large components from previous operation that have been stored on site and must be dispositioned as part of decommissioning. These include eight retired steam generators, and 2 retired reactor vessel closure heads.

The 2011 study includes the disposition of radioactive material used to operate the SONGS site (such as refueling tools). This material is managed in SONGS' REMP system.

The study includes costs for removal of hazardous waste on site at shutdown, including asbestos, lead, oil, diesel fuel, mercury, PCBs, acid solutions, caustic solutions, hydrazine, and others.

The 2011 study does not assume that any large components from previous operation have been stored on site and must be dispositioned as part of decommissioning.
