I. INTRODUCTION

In compliance with Rules 23 and 24 of the California Public Utilities'

Commission's (Commission or CPUC) Rules of Practice and Procedure and Ordering

Paragraph 3 of Commission Decision (D.) 05-01-056, San Diego Gas & Electric

Company (SDG&E) submits this Application for approval of a portfolio of Demand

Response Programs (DRP) and related budgets for years 2006 through 2008 (the

Application).

As discussed in greater detail below and in the testimony attached hereto, the Application seeks Commission authority to: 1) implement a portfolio of Demand Response Programs; and, 2) expend the associated program budgets.

II. BACKGROUND

On June 10, 2002, the Commission opened Rulemaking (R.) 02-06-001 to determine policies and practices for advanced metering, demand response and dynamic pricing. In its request for rulemaking, the Commission stated:

We emphasize that demand-responsive capabilities are important regardless of the ultimate electricity market structure that emerges in the next few years. A perfectly functioning wholesale and/or retail electricity market is not a precondition for development of demand response. On the contrary, demand-responsive capability can be a tool in mitigating the effects of a dysfunctional market, as well as for controlling costs, even in a completely vertically integrated and regulated market.¹

As its first task, the Commission declared its intent to "...consider a strategic approach to the orderly development of demand-responsiveness capability in the California electricity market over the next 18 months."²

On June 6, 2003, the Commission issued D.03-06-032 which set "annual megawatt (MW) targets to be met through demand response programs and included in investor-owned utility (IOU) procurement plans." For SDG&E, the Commission adopted the following demand reduction targets: 30 MW for 2003, 80 MW for 2004, and 3% of annual system peak demand for 2005, rising to 4% in 2006 and 5% in 2007.

On January 27, 2005, the Commission issued D.05-01-056, which approved Demand Response Programs and budgets for SDG&E, Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) and Southern California Edison (SCE) for 2005 only. The Commission directed the utilities to file 2006-2008 demand response program proposals in new applications on June 1, 2005, concurrent with their 2006-2008 energy efficiency applications (Ordering Paragraph (OP) 3). This application is filed in response to that directive.

III. SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

The Application is supported by five SDG&E witnesses: Patricia Wagner,
Director Customer Programs; Susie E. Sides, Demand Response Programs Manager;
Kenneth Deremer, Regulatory Accounts Manager; Leslie Willoughby, Load Analysis
Manager and Brad Baugh, Software Development Manager. The witnesses' prepared
direct testimony are attached hereto, incorporated in the Application by reference, and
summarized below:

A. Policy (Chapter I)

SDG&E witness Patricia Wagner describes SDG&E's underlying policy behind the company's proposed DRP portfolio. Ms. Wagner emphasizes SDG&E's strong support of the Energy Action Plan (EAP) and belief that an integrated approach toward planning for the future energy needs of its customers will best meet the EAP's aggressive goals.

B. DRP Proposals and Budgets (Chapter II)

The testimony of witness Susie Sides describes SDG&E's proposed DRP initiatives in detail including the budgets necessary to accomplish the programs' goals. Ms. Sides also explains why SDG&E supports establishment of an annual process through which the utilities can seek Commission approval for program changes, budget modifications, new program proposals, and elimination of or revisions to underperforming programs.

C. Cost Recovery (Chapter III)

SDG&E witness Kenneth Deremer addresses SDG&E's proposal to record and recover DRP costs using the company's existing Advanced Metering and Demand Response Memorandum Account (AMDRMA) and to consolidate various existing regulatory accounts that reflect demand response costs that are similar in nature with the same disposition.

D. Information Technology (IT) (Chapter IV)

This Chapter, sponsored by witness Brad Baugh, describes the types and costs of SDG&E IT system adjustments needed to support the proposed programs.

E. DRP Measurement and Evaluation (Chapter V)

The testimony of Leslie Willoughby describes the Demand Response Program

Measurement and Evaluation efforts, including quantifying the amount of demand
response that can be achieved from utility customers participating in the program.

IV. RATE AND REVENUE IMPACTS

The proposed Demand Response Program budgets in 2006-08 will change from the current budget of \$21.063 million to \$21.109 million; \$18.646 million; and \$15.876 million, respectively. Illustrative electric distribution revenue and rate impacts resulting from the proposed DRP budgets for years 2006-2008 are presented in Section V.E. below. Annual class average electric distribution rates are projected to increase by less than 1% resulting from the three year program period expenditures. As described in the testimony of Witness Kenneth Deremer (Chapter III), distribution-related DRP costs are proposed to be recorded to the AMDRMA and transferred to the Rewards and Penalties

Balancing Account (RPBA) for annual recovery in electric distribution rates beginning January 1, 2007.

V. STATUTORY AND PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS

A. Scoping Issues – Rule 6

Commission rule 6(a)(1) requires SDG&E to state in this application "the proposed category for the proceeding, the need for hearing, the issues to be considered, and a proposed schedule." SDG&E proposes to categorize this application as a rate-setting proceeding since this application will determine the reasonableness of its demand response program expenditures for future recovery. SDG&E does not believe hearings will be necessary but respectfully requests that the Commission adopt a final decision during the fourth-quarter of 2005 so that we have ample time to implement these programs effective January 1, 2006.

B. Legal Name and Correspondence - Rules 15(a) and 15(b)

San Diego Gas & Electric Company is a public utility organized and existing under the laws of the State of California. It is a gas and electric corporation engaged in the business of providing public utility electric service to portions of southern Orange County and gas and electric service throughout San Diego County. SDG&E's principal place of business and mailing address is 8330 Century Park Court, San Diego, CA 92123.

F. Description of Property and Equipment - Rule 23(d)

A general description of SDG&E's property and equipment was previously filed with the Commission in connection with SDG&E's Application No. 01-10-005 and is incorporated herein by reference. A statement of account of the original cost and depreciation reserve attributable thereto is attached to this Application as Appendix B.

G. Summary of Earnings – Rules 23 (e and f)

A summary of earnings is attached to this application as Appendix C.

H. Depreciation - Rule 23(h)

For financial statement purposes, depreciation of utility plant has been computed on a straight-line remaining life basis at rates based on the estimated useful lives of plant properties. For federal income tax accrual purposes, the Company generally computes depreciation using the straight-line method for tax property additions prior to 1954, and liberalized depreciation, which includes Class Life, and Asset Depreciation Range Systems on tax property additions after 1954 and prior to 1981. For financial reporting and rate-fixing purposes, "flow through accounting" has been adopted for such properties. For tax property additions in years 1981 through 1986, the Company has computed its tax depreciation using the Accelerated Cost Recovery System. For years after 1986, the Company has computed its tax depreciation using the Modified Accelerated Cost Recovery Systems and since 1982, has normalized the effects of the depreciation differences in accordance with the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981 and the Tax Reform Act of 1986.

I. Proxy Statement - Rule 23(i)

A copy of SDG&E's latest Proxy Statement was filed with the Commission May 2, 2005, in connection with Application 05-05-003 and is incorporated herein by reference.

J. Statement Pursuant to Rule 23(1)

The increase sought in this application does not reflect and pass through to customers only increased costs to SDG&E for the services or commodities furnished by it.

K. Service of Notice - Rule 24

SDG&E will electronically serve a Notice of Availability of this application and related exhibits to all parties of record in the Commission's Rulemaking (R.) 02-06-001 and the government agencies listed in Appendix D of this application.

VI. CONCLUSION

SDG&E respectfully requests that the Commission issue an order:

- 1. Finding that SDG&E's proposed demand response programs and related budgets are reasonable;
- 2. Approve SDG&E's proposed cost recovery mechanism and proposal to consolidate various existing regulatory accounts; and
- 3. Granting such additional relief as the Commission may deem proper.

SDG&E is ready to proceed with its showing.
