

Risk-Informed Drone Inspections (RIDI) Program

As part of our commitment to providing safe and reliable energy, we're proactively addressing fire risk.

The Risk-Informed Drone Inspection (RIDI) Program is part of SDG&E's Wildfire Mitigation Plan (WMP) efforts. The RIDI Program enhances the evaluation of SDG&E's overhead electric powerlines and equipment within identified High Fire Threat District areas (see map on back).

About RIDI Program

In support of SDG&E's Wildfire Mitigation Program, the RIDI Program will assess SDG&E® electric power lines using drone technology to identify necessary repairs or improvements and to reduce the risk of wildfire.

What to expect

SDG&E crews and/or our approved contractors will be conducting a comprehensive assessment of overhead electric power lines on or near your property using drone technology.

To complete this assessment, SDG&E crews and/or contractors will need access to our electric powerline easements and Rights-of-Way locations on or near your property.

Drones will be used to collect photographs of SDG&E electric infrastructure which will be evaluated by SDG&E personnel. The objective of the program is to take photos of SDG&E's infrastructure and not the surrounding areas.

Our commitment to providing clean, safe, and reliable energy means routine investigations and assessments of our electric power lines.



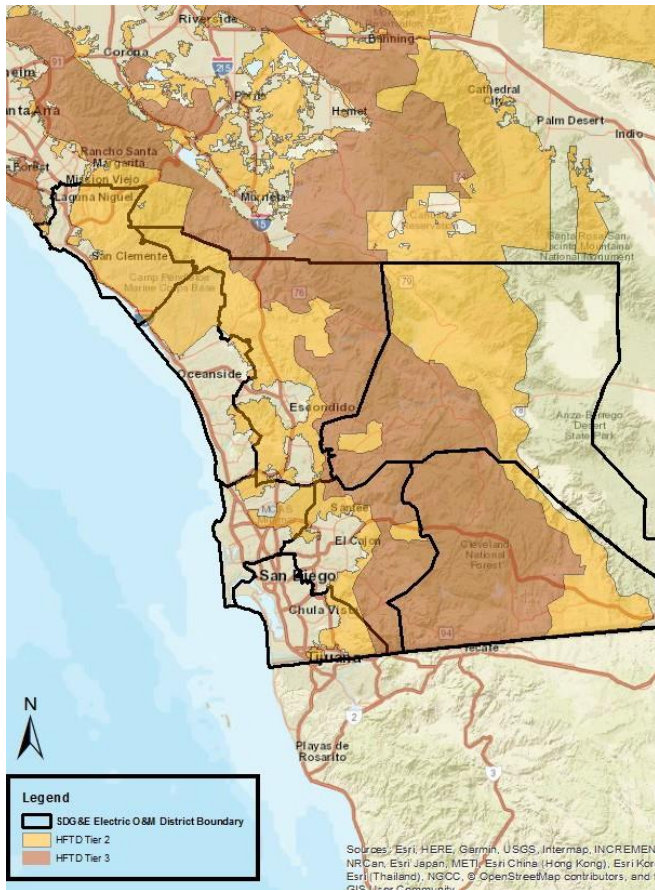
Drone-related activities may temporarily increase surrounding noise levels or dust.
