



Bundled Electric Rate Change Alert

On February 29, 2024, San Diego Gas & Electric® (SDG&E®) filed Advice Letter 4366-E to consolidate recently approved electric requests. As a result, SDG&E's bundled residential average electric rates will increase by approximately 2.1 cents/kWh or 5.7% from 36.2 cents/kWh to 38.3 cents/kWh.¹ However, when compared to rates in effect in 2023, SDG&E's bundled residential average electric rates are still 11% lower.

A bundled customer is one who receives both their electric delivery and electric generation from SDG&E. Average residential monthly bill impacts for a typical bundled customer are shown below.

- Updated authorized cost of capital because of rising interest rates to support investments needed to maintain the safety, integrity, and award-winning reliability of the system.

Regulatory decisions are still pending that may be implemented into rates throughout 2024.³ The timing and final outcome of these decisions are currently unknown but will be included in future rate alerts.

Unbundled Electric Rate Change Alert

On February 29, 2024, San Diego Gas & Electric (SDG&E) filed Advice Letter 4366-E to consolidate recently approved electric requests. As a result, SDG&E's residential average electric delivery rates will increase by approximately 2.0 cents/kWh or 9.7% from 21.1 cents/kWh to 23.1 cents/kWh.¹ However, when compared to rates in effect in 2023, SDG&E's residential average electric delivery rates are still 2% lower.

An unbundled customer is someone who receives their electric generation from another provider such as a Community Choice Aggregator (CCA). For additional information on your electric generation rate, please reach out to your electricity provider.² Average residential monthly bill impacts for a typical unbundled customer are shown below.
