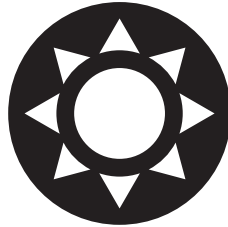


Did you know?...

Summer pricing took effect June 1 and as temperatures rise, your energy use may too. Here are some things you may not know about your energy use that may help you manage your bill:



Water heating accounts for 30% of your home's total energy use*

The longer you run hot water, the higher your energy use and bills. To save, try reducing how much hot water you use and lower your water heater temperature a few degrees.

You have "Energy Vampires" in your house

Appliances can continue to drain power from electrical outlets, even when turned off or idle. According to the U.S. Department of Energy, this can cost the average household several hundred dollars annually. Unplug electronics when not in use. Using a power strip with on/off control can help.

You can get the recipe to energy savings

Using the oven during the summer can add heat to your home, requiring more energy to cool your home. Try to avoid using the oven and instead use small appliances such as an air fryer, toaster oven or slow cooker. They use less energy and won't add much heat to your home. Or try no-heat meals, such as salads, wraps or subs. You can even fire up the grill outdoors and enjoy the weather.

California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) Program: Save 30% or more every month on your bill. Find out if you qualify at sdge.com/CARE.

Request this alert if heat is harmful to your health

If extreme heat would be harmful to the health of anyone living in your home and a moderate indoor temperature is a must, be sure to enroll in SDG&E's **Temperature Sensitive Program**. With this free service, you'll receive advance notice, if possible, of power outages. An automated phone call will alert you to prepare for a temporary loss of air conditioning.



To sign up for the Temperature Sensitive Program, download the program application at sdge.com/TempSensitive.

If you participate in SDG&E's **Medical Baseline Program**, then you're already on the call list for outage notices and do not need to enroll in the Temperature Sensitive Program.
