It takes two: generation and delivery

CCAs generate or purchase energy for customers in their communities. SDG&E delivers that energy to your home or business. If you aren't a CCA customer, SDG&E handles both generation and delivery of your energy. For all customers, SDG&E provides billing and customer care services and is responsible for maintaining and modernizing delivery infrastructure.

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Breaking down your bill

Bills can be complicated, and we're here to help you understand what goes into your energy bill. Your electric bill includes three types of charges: Electric Generation, Electric Delivery and State, Taxes & Other.



Electric Generation

The charge for electricity used in your home or business that has been generated or purchased by a CCA or by SDG&E. Check the Electric Generation section of your bill to see if you are a CCA customer.



Electric Delivery

The SDG&E charge for delivering electricity to your location including billing, customer service and maintaining and modernizing infrastructure in our communities.



State, Taxes & Other Charges

Local and state government charges, including taxes and city franchise fees. Also, charges for the state-mandated Wildfire Fund and public purpose programs, including energy efficiency programs.
