



PIPELINE SAFETY

Dear Property Owner or Resident:

As part of our system-wide plan to enhance our natural gas pipeline system throughout the communities we serve, I want to let you know we will be in your area soon to replace a section of one of our older natural gas pipelines. The MCAS Miramar Replacement Project will install approximately 3.5 miles of new state of the art pipe in the City of San Diego. The pipeline construction will start on Kearny Mesa Road near the intersection of Kearny Villa Road, then heads south along Kearny Villa Road, ending south of Highway 52 just before the intersection of Kearny Villa Road and Waxie Way.

This project is part of our Pipeline Safety Enhancement Plan, or PSEP, which identifies various pipeline sections for review and upgrade as needed. PSEP was approved by the California Public Utilities Commission in 2014. Since that time, SDG&E® has upgraded and modernized approximately 54 miles of natural gas pipeline in San Diego County.

MCAS Miramar Replacement Project Details:

Projected Start Date:	Early May 2023
Construction Location:	On Kearny Mesa Road near the intersection of Kearny Villa Road, then heads south along Kearny Villa Road, ending south of Highway 52 just before the intersection of Kearny Villa Road and Waxie Way.
Construction Times:	Primarily <u>NIGHTTIME WORK HOURS</u> – Sunday through Thursday evenings from 9:00 p.m. – 5:00 a.m. (EXCEPTION: work on Kearny Mesa Road <u>ONLY</u> will be daytime work hours Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.) (restricted work hours may take place in certain areas and near schools, based on City permit requirements, with the potential for weekend work, if needed). <i>*Dates and times are subject to change according to compliance requirements, inclement weather and other unforeseen circumstances</i>
No Service Interruption:	Your gas service should continue without interruption, however if something changes, an SDG&E representative will contact you.
Access:	Access to your property will not be impacted; however, there could be traffic delays due to construction.

What to Expect:

Traffic lanes along Kearny Mesa Road and Kearny Villa Road and near Miramar Way, Harris Plant Road, H Avenue and Waxie Way could be reduced in and around the construction area during approved work hours. Flagmen and traffic control signs will assist with the flow of traffic. Lane closures will only be in effect during the work hours noted above and will be marked with traffic cones and signs. Motorists are asked to follow all traffic signs and markers for their safety and the safety of others. Recessed steel plates will cover the affected construction areas as necessary until that area has been completed and the street has been restored.

The Odor of Natural Gas:

There may be a few limited times during construction where you may smell the odor of natural gas and hear a loud, steady noise as natural gas is vented from the pipeline using safe and established techniques. Although this is normal when crews are working, we encourage anyone who has concerns about the smell of gas to call us from a safe location at **1-800-411-7343**.

We apologize for any inconvenience while we perform this important pipeline safety work and appreciate your patience and cooperation. Construction in front of your residence or business is expected to last several weeks to more than a month. Total project completion, including pipe installation, testing and street restoration work, is estimated to be completed by approximately year end 2023.
