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PREPARED DIRECT TESTIMONY OF NORMA G. JASSO CHAPTER 6

I. OVERVIEW AND PURPOSE

The purpose of my direct testimony on behalf of San Diego Gas & Electric Company ("SDG&E") is to discuss the proposed balancing accounts related to SDG&E's Medium-Duty and Heavy-Duty Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure Program ("MD/HD EV Charging Infrastructure Program" or "Program") and Vehicle to Grid Electric School Bus Pilot ("V2G Pilot"). SDG&E proposes to record revenue and costs associated with the MD/HD EV Charging Infrastructure Program and V2G Pilot in balancing accounts until the program and pilot are in service and submitted as part of base margin revenue requirement in a future General Rate Case ("GRC").

II. COST RECOVERY

SDG&E requests authority to establish one-way balancing accounts to record the authorized revenue requirement and costs associated with (1) the MD/HD EV Charging Infrastructure Program (see direct testimony of Hannon J. Rasool (Chapter 2)); and (2) the V2G Pilot (see direct testimony of David M. Goldgraben (Chapter 3)). SDG&E proposes to recover costs from all electric customer classes through distribution rates for both the Program and the Pilot.

SDG&E proposes to establish the Medium-Duty / Heavy-Duty Electric Vehicle
Balancing Account ("MDHDBA") to record the authorized revenue requirement and incremental
costs resulting from the implementation of the MD/HD EV Charging Infrastructure Program. A
separate Vehicle to Grid Balancing Account ("V2GBA") would be established for the V2G Pilot.
SDG&E proposes to record revenues associated with the authorized revenue requirement as well
as capital-related costs (*i.e.*, depreciation, taxes and return) and operating and maintenance

incremental costs in the above balancing accounts. Details of the revenue requirement are
 presented in the direct testimony of Gregory D. Shimansky (Chapter 5).

The disposition of the MDHDBA and V2GBA will be addressed in SDG&E's Annual Electric Regulatory Account Update filing at the end of the program and pilot. The annual filing is scheduled to be submitted as a Tier 2 advice letter in October of each year. In this Tier 2 advice letter, SDG&E presents the forecasted year-end balances of certain regulatory accounts for amortization in rates effective January 1 of the following year. SDG&E proposes to address the final disposition and closing of these accounts in a future GRC.

This concludes my prepared direct testimony.

My name is Norma G. Jasso. I am employed by SDG&E, as the Regulatory Accounts Analysis Manager in the Financial Analysis Department.
