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Pursuant to Article 2 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (Rules), and Commission Resolution E-4906, Ordering Paragraph (OP) 37 at 100-102, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E) submits this application.

I. INTRODUCTION

A. The basis for this application

Resolution E-4906, OP 37, directs the Utilities¹ "to file separate Applications with the Commission to allow appropriate consideration and allow for evidence development on the issue of loggers and meters." OP 37 requests information on SDG&E's Demand Response (DR) programs and how to monitor third-party-aggregated customers' use of Backup Generators (BUGs), the technology available, and the associated costs. SDG&E provides the information requested by OP 37 in testimony served with this application, and asks that the Commission accept the testimony as compliant with OP 37.

B. Supporting testimony

SDG&E is serving, contemporaneously with this application, supporting prepared direct testimony by Jerry Stewart, SDG&E's Smart Meter Operations Manager. Mr. Stewart's

Southern California Edison Company (SCE), Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), and SDG&E are the "Utilities."

testimony provides responses to the questions propounded by OP 37. The testimony is based on SDG&E's experience performing measurement and verification of distributed generation (DG) within SDG&E's service territory, as well as input from SDG&E's metering vendor, Itron, Inc. SDG&E's entire advanced metering infrastructure (AMI) system is provided by Itron, which consists of approximately 1.3 million electric smart meters and approximately 900,000 smart gas modules. In addition, Itron has extensive experience performing measurement and verification of DG and DR programs throughout the country. Because of our long-standing relationship with Itron and its measurement devices, SDG&E consulted with Itron to answer the OP 37 questions. Also, in preparing this testimony, Mr. Stewart necessarily consulted with other SDG&E subject matter experts for customer data and incentive levels.

II. STATUTORY AND PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS

A. Rule 2.1 – relief sought by this application

SDG&E requests that the Commission find that the prepared testimony served in support of this application complies with OP 37, and that the Commission provide guidance on how to proceed with monitoring DR customer usage of BUGs.

SDG&E is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of California. This application does *not* request authority to construct a project, to increase rates, to issue stock, to acquire, encumber or transfer utility property, or an exemption from undergrounding rules.
