



Bundled Electric Rate Decrease Alert

In May 2026, San Diego Gas & Electric® (SDG&E®) filed [Advice Letter 4843-E](#) to decrease electric rates. As a result, SDG&E's bundled residential average electric rates will decrease by approximately 0.9 cents/kWh or 2.0% from 46.4 cents/kWh to 45.5 cents/kWh.¹

A bundled customer is someone who receives both their electric delivery and electric generation from SDG&E. Average residential monthly bill impacts for a typical bundled customer are shown below.

Unbundled Electric Rate Decrease Alert

In May 2026, San Diego Gas & Electric® (SDG&E®) filed [Advice Letter 4843-E](#) to decrease electric rates. As a result, SDG&E’s residential average electric delivery rates will decrease by approximately 0.9 cents/kWh or 3.15% from 28.8 cents/kWh to 27.9 cents/kWh.¹

An unbundled customer is someone who receives their electric generation from another provider such as a Community Choice Aggregator (CCA). For additional information on your electric generation rate, please reach out to your electricity generator.² Average monthly residential bill impacts for a typical unbundled customer are shown below.
